The joint committee meeting of Public Agencies and Infrastructure was held on September 28, 2010 at HESS. We had a nice turnout to hear Mr. Mike Stone of the Ft. Bend Toll Road Authority.



Mr. Stone was an original board member of the Ft. Bend Toll Road Authority (FTBTRA). He is now a part-time employee and with his associate, Chad Essex, they make up the entire paid FTBTRA staff. The Authority partners and uses consultants to keep its operating staff and budget to a minimum while still delivering a highly efficient service.

Some basic facts:

- FTBTRA was established in 1996.
- First two projects were built with \$140M in bonds and some cash from TxDOT for a total cost of \$165M.
- Both opened early and under budget.
- The Ft. Bend Parkway turned 6 last month and Westpark is 5 years old.
- They are typically collecting \$17M in revenue and \$7M in debt service, \$4M in operational costs, \$240K in adm and most of the rest goes into a Repair and Replace Fund.
- FTBTRA has one of the lowest violation indexes for Texas Toll Roads with over 97% collections. This can be compared to some facilities that see only 65% collections and have thousands of cheaters, some who owe upwards of \$70K!

Mike indicated the main reason that FTBCTRA and HCTRA have such high collection rates is that they will arrest big violators. For them, once someone reaches \$1000 in violations and repeatedly has turned down the opportunity to solve the problem, they are targeted. Last month they arrested 29 violators.

For the future, they have four programs they are looking at. To become a candidate a project must meet three rules:

1. The Project must be needed.
2. No one else will build it.
3. It makes financial sense with tolls alone and any grants or partnering.

Of the projects they are looking at, the Grand Parkway (GPA), Section D could possibly move the fastest. This \$160M project is to build a number of tolled overpasses along the GPA, Section D. It meets the first two criteria and they are waiting on a Wilbur Smith feasibility study to determine if it meets the third. They expect a draft this year with the Final Report in January.
